Diocese Protects Kids from Pedophiles' Lures

From the prisons of Tennessee to the PIE to a Sherlockian young computer hacker in London, Kenneth Wooden has spent a lifetime gathering information that will have been shillen seen to be the property of th that will help keep children safe, not just from sexual predators, but from becoming victims of many types of exploitation.

He has testified before Congress 14

times. The Secret Service, 60 Minutes, 20/20, and countless other prestigious law enforcement organizations and media outlets have tapped his expertise as a consultant, speaker, and trainer.

Last week, under the auspices of the diocesan Safe Environment Program, Wooden shared his knowledge in awareness and "train the trainers" lectures at Our Lady of Angels, Bay Ridge, and the Immaculate Conception Center, Douglaston. Pastors, priests, principals, and DREs began to learn about Wooden's Lures" program, which beginning in January will be a fixture in every parochial school and religious education program in the diocese.

The expected result is that thousands of children will know how to keep them-selves safe and resist the "lures" of


ground, that alone would lead you to say, this man knows what he's talking about.

Wooden's passion for children's safety first surfaced upon his return from the Korean conflict, when he "missed the GI Bill by 30 days." Unable to afford college, he obtained a job with the New Jersey State Police as a fingerprint expert, and found his reward in one particular week-

"What I really loved was, every Thursday afternoon, I would get a couple of hundred sets of fingerprints of people wanting to drive school buses," Wooden recalled, "I would catch one or two dozen child molesters every week just by matching their fingerprints with crimi-nal records."

Wooden's success led to a stint on a prison reform commission, where he found the jails overcrowded with what he terms "status offenders" - runaways, truants, and others who had committed no crimes but had nowhere else to be.

Their plight inspired his first book,
"Weeping in the Playtime of Others,"
which "Mike Wallace read poolside at
Ronald Reagan's estate," chuckles
Wooden, who then became Wallace's trusted source on child abuse and a fea-

operated and how they could realistically be thwarted. The Lures program is the result. The program lists 17 specific types of lures pedophiles use on children, and trains children not only to resist those specific lures, but other inappropri-ate overtures as well. And the comprehensive four-part program includes training the trainers, a two-day in-school program, a Parent Guide to empower understanding and follow-up at home, and a TV news series excerpted from Wooden's appearances on national televi-

"I'm not here to sell a program, I'm here to sell a partnership," says Wooden. "It's highly enlightening to teach the teachers how organized the predators are. That's been true for audiences ranging from Congressional committees to PTA luncheons. It motivates them to teach or take action.

Of course, the program is not static; Wooden's research continues. With the internet becoming an ever more vital medium for pedophile operations, Wooden, a self-confessed computer illiterate, turned to experts for support.

"I read in the newspapers about a kid going to prison for hacking Microsoft and Boeing Aircraft," Wooden said. "The judge gave me Michael Wilkinson for 200 hours of community service, and I asked him to bring two hackers from elsewhere as well. He came to Vermont and brought his 'representatives' from Philadelphia and London, England!

The program now includes a sample internet use contract for parents to sign with their kids, which includes day like "I will not respond to people I dun't know." It's simple, practical tools like that, which are based on specific research on pedophile techniques, that make Wooden's program successful Plus of course, his very down-to-earth teathing approach.

"I never liked puppets, McGruff and stuff," Wooden confesses. "They're fun, but the kids can miss the point. I'm more direct. To train my kids how important it is not to run out into the street, I'd take them out into the neighborhood and show them a flat cat.

"Knowing how organized predators are, I've designed something to prevent their specific techniques. Predators have told me in prison they couldn't crack this training. For the first time in history, we're giving kids specific boundaries.

"We have a lot of fun teaching this program. The kids enjoy it, and they realy get it. We teach by asking questions We teach them the concept of lure - how do you catch a fish? What's another word for bait? What's the largest computer in the world? (It's the human brain.) Let's program that computer to resist lurs

pedophiles and other potential preda-According to Sister Pat Hudson, director of the Safe Environment Program, that's the logical next step for the dioces

"The Safe Environment Program has done a lot of work in training adults in sex abuse awareness over the past twoand-a-half years," said Sister Pat. "We are now moving into directly helping children understand what they need to do to help protect themselves.

"We've researched many programs," she explained. "We've chosen this one because it's the most reality-based, it deals with very specific situations, it's manageable for the teachers, it's very straightforward, and it's what we want the kids to learn. It's also broader than just sex abuse education; it's really a personal safety program.

"Many many priests and pastors came to hear Ken. It attests to the serious commitment the priests have to doing something to avoid sex abuse of children. If you look at Ken's back-

tured presentation on 60 Minutes on "Kiddie Porn." That led to contact with a minister in Tennessee whose farm for wayward boys turned out to be the center of a national child prostitution ring. Wooden got the assignment to investi-gate how the ring operated, and his eyes were opened wide.

"These people actually had a newslet-ter called PIE – the Pedophile Information Exchange – and it included a feature called 'Lure of the Month', explained Wooden. Essentially, each "lure" was a tip on how best to enlist a child's cooperation in their own destruc-

"The lure of the month was soap crayons," Wooden recalls. "I was appalled. We had gotten our own daughters soap crayons so they could draw in the bath-

Determined to save children from such monstrous perversion, Wooden began lecturing nationwide, And everywhere he went, he visited prisons and interviewed pedophiles to learn how they
