Pope Simplifies Norm For Sex Abuse Cases

VATICAN CITY (CNS) – A leading Vatican official said Pope Benedict XVI's approval of revised norms on clerical sex abuse sent a clear signal that the Church is serious about protecting children and punishing abusive priests. At the same time, the official said, the Vatican norms alone cannot resolve the problem of sexual abuse, which will require a continued and coordinated effort at every level of the church.

Msgr. Charles Scicluna, the promoter of justice at the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, made the comments at a briefing for reporters on the revised norms, which simplified and streamlined many of the Church's procedures in dealing with priests accused of sexual abuse of minors.

Msgr. Scicluna said the doctrinal congregation was grateful to the pope for transforming into universal church law a number of practices aimed at dealing more quickly and efficiently with priest abusers.

"I think it gives a signal that we are very, very serious about our commitment to promote safe environments and to offer an adequate response to abuse," he said.

"This is a very important step from the technical viewpoint of canon law. But a document is always a document - it does not solve all the problems. It's a very important instrument, but it's the way you use the instrument that's going to have the real effect on the life of the Church," he

The main provisions of the revised norms:

- Extend the statute of limitations from 10 to 20 years after a sex abuse vic tim's 18th birthday.
 - Include use of child pornography as a type of sexual abuse of minors.
 - Establish parity between abuse of mentally disabled people and that if

- Confirm that the doctrinal congregation can use an "extra-judicial" process to quickly remove an accused priest from active ministry.
