

- Classes are held from September to May at sites around the diocese; weeknight and Saturday class options.
- Murtures our baptismal call to ministry by providing foundational knowledge and skills for ministry on the parish/regional level.
- ** Study scripture, the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Church documents and theological works.
- Collaboration with other diocesan departments to offer formation for leadership in a specific area of ministry.
- Applicants must be nominated by their pastor or parish administrator prior to applying; application deadline is July 31st.
- Affordable cost, shared by parish and participant; some scholarship assistance available.
- Option to end participation after two years or continue formation for a specific ministry.

The Lay Ministry Program is for you if you:

- ** Have an integrated Catholic faith and prayer life
- » Regularly participate in the sacramental life of the church
- » Are open to personal transformation and on-going human development
- Are ready for ongoing study of the faith
- Have tolerance for viewpoints other than you own
- Demonstrate potential for leadership in ministry and a desire to work collaboratively with clergy, religious and other lay persons
- ** Are a fully initiated lay member of the Christian faithful who exhibits fidelity to the teachings of the Magisterium; all candidates must provide sacramental proof of baptism, confirmation, and marriage, where applicable, to their parish office.

Program's Initial Stage – Two Years

FIRST YEAR

- » Orientation session and theological conference
- ** Courses: Theology of Lay Ministry, Ecclesiology, Old Testament and New Testament

SECOND YEAR

Courses: Liturgy and Sacraments, Ecumenical / Interreligious Dialogue, Christology and Moral Theology

Two required and two elective **online courses** during the first and second year

SPIRITUAL FORMATION DAYS

"Two per year will help you to make "faith sense" of your experiences in the Lay Ministry Program and to recognize how and where God may be calling you to ministry.

MENTORING

- Mentor assigned by parish
- Process facilitates your dialogue with the parish staff and helps you to discern your choice of ministry.

Program's Second Stage

At the end of the second year, if you wish to continue your formation, you will elect to enter one of the following Ministerial Specialty Tracks:

- >>> Volunteer Lay Pastoral Leader
- » Catechetical Leader
- >>> Pastoral Associate
- **Parish Management**
- Your preparation may include: pastoral skills workshops, a ministry seminar, spiritual formation days, supervised ministry project and graduate level studies in theology or related field.

At the conclusion of the program, you are expected to participate in 10 hours of ongoing formation each year while in ministry.

Diocesan Faculty
