REPORT ON FUNDRAISING ACTIVITY

SPEAKERS PROGRAM

During the months of February and March the Pastoral Institute piloted a program where commissioned pastoral leaders visited and made presentations at parishes in the diocese to talk about the Pastoral Institute and its Lay Ministry Program. These talks were well received by everyone involved and we intend to have more of these. But we need your help.

In order to reach more people and tell them about **“the best kept secret in the diocese”** we need more volunteers to go out to the parishes. Not everyone has to be a speaker because we need people to accompany them to make sure things are coordinated and to distribute materials. In addition to one weekend spent at a parish, the time commitment

involves two meetings – one for training and one for evaluation – at the Immaculate Conception Center in Douglaston.

ONLINE CONTINUING EDUCATION

As a commissioned lay pastoral leader you are encouraged to continue your formation and to take seriously the need to constantly update and enhance your theological understanding and spiritual development. One way to do this is to take advantage of the Pastoral Institute's partnership with the University of Notre Dame's Satellite Theological Education Program (STEP), which provides online continuing education

opportunities. To date there have been 16 enrollments in courses taking advantage of the Diocese of Brooklyn's 50% discount that makes the tuition for each course less than \$50. Comments received so far have been very positive concerning the learning experience.

STEP has over **40 online courses available** and all are designed with the adult learner in mind. Most are six weeks

long and require about a 3-5 hour commitment each week. Included in the offerings are courses on scripture, prayer, liturgy & sacraments, Catholic social teaching and Jesus Christ. We hope that many more of you will take advantage of this exciting endeavor. To register and enroll go to <http://step.nd.edu> to create an account and register for a course.
