RESULTS OF 2009 MINISTRY SURVEY

During the Spring of 2009 the Pastoral Institute conducted a survey of all commissioned lay pastoral leaders to determine the extent to which you are involved in ministry. The results show that you are a blessing to the people of the Diocese of Brooklyn by your willingness to volunteer many hours of time serving the people of God in many capacities in your parishes.

Since the beginning of the *Lay Ministry Program* in 2001, 496 persons have been commissioned by the diocesan bishop as lay pastoral leaders after completing the program of theological education, spiritual formation, mentoring and ministry preparation. In addition, there are currently a total of 231 persons enrolled in the Spanish and English language tracks of the program who are expected to complete leadership formation over the next three years.

The results of the survey indicate the depth of your involvement in volunteer ministerial leadership positions. The survey asked you to indicate all of the ministries in which you are involved as a volunteer coordinator, team/committee member or participant.

Of the 496 persons surveyed, 65 did not respond and another 36 are no longer involved in parish

ministry in the diocese for one of several of reasons. The remaining 395 persons are actively engaged in parish ministry and most of them are involved in more than one ministry.

The survey showed that our commissioned lay leaders participate in many ministries. However, those with the greatest amount of participation are Adult Faith Formation, Liturgical Planning, Parish/Diocesan Leadership – especially the Parish Planning Councils, RCIA/Sacramental Preparation and Religious Education of Children and Youth.

In addition, pastoral leaders are involved in parishes as Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Ushers and Greeters, as well as members of several parish organizations (Rosary-Altar Society, Holy Name Society, Knights of Columbus, etc.).

We at the Pastoral Institute are thankful for all of you who have answered the call to ministerial leadership by participating in the *Lay Ministry Program* and for the dedicated persons who serve as your instructors, mentors, retreat leaders and ministry supervisors. We pray that there will be many more who accept the challenge to be formed as lay Church leaders for the 21st century.

ALUMNI DAY OF REFLECTION

Approximately 30 alumni braved the cold on December 12, 2009, for the Alumni Day of Reflection, which was held at the Immaculate Conception Center, Douglaston. The presenter was **Deacon Michael Vicinanza**, Dean of Diaconate Formation. The theme for the Day of Reflection was **“Radiating Christ in Ministry as Gift to the Father.”** The first part of Deacon Mike’s presentation dealt with how we, as Christians, could give Christ the power to live

again, in and through our lives and ministries. The second part of the presentation focused on the Contemporary Marian Spirituality of St. Maximillian Kolbe and St. Louis de Montfort. The day also included lunch and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction in the Bishop’s Chapel. When the Day of Reflection was over, many persons commented that they were grateful for this opportunity to gather with other alumni and to be refreshed spiritually.

UPCOMING OPPORTUNITIES FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH IN 2010

The Alumni Executive Committee members have been hard at work planning opportunities for continuing education and spiritual growth for this New Year. Below is a brief description of what alumni can look forward to in 2010 -

On **Saturday, April 17th** at St. Francis of Assisi-St. Blaise (Brooklyn), Rev. Charles Caccavale of the Immaculate Conception Seminary at Huntington will give a workshop on beginning-of-life issues. You may recall that last March Fr. Charles gave a talk on medical ethics dealing with end-of-life

issues that was very well received. We believe that this new workshop will be just as enlightening especially in light of the ongoing public debates on abortion.

The **2010 Alumni Reunion and Fundraiser** is scheduled for **Saturday, June 12th** at The Mary Louis Academy in Jamaica Estates, Queens. This year the guest speaker will be Dr. Rose Zuzworsky. The theme of her presentation will be *Environmental Concern from a Catholic Perspective*.

Both topics, beginning-of-life issues and the environment, are in the forefront of the public and political arena. As commissioned lay leaders, you are responsible for continuing your formation and it would be important for you to understand these issues from a Catholic perspective.

For the Fall, an **Alumni Weekend Retreat** is being planned for the weekend of October 22nd-24th at the Bishop Molloy Retreat House in Jamaica Estates, Queens. More information will follow when it becomes available.

ONLINE CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Pastoral Institute, through its partnership with the University of Notre Dame's Satellite Theological Education Program (STEP), is pleased to offer the opportunity for commissioned pastoral leaders to continue their education through **online theology courses**. STEP has over 40 courses available online and all are designed with the adult learner in mind. Most are six weeks long and require about a 3 to 5 hour commitment each week.



With a Diocese of Brooklyn 50% discount, **all courses will be less than \$50**. The following courses are just a few that are offered: *The Doctrine of Salvation in Jesus Christ, Mary as Mother, A Symbol of Life and Hope for Christians*, and *The RCIA: Can We Get the Rite Right?*

To register and enroll go to STEP's homepage (www.step.nd.edu) to create an account and register for a course. If this is your first time considering an online course, don't be discouraged. It is very easy to register.
