

A Lectionary Based Course

Each lesson is aligned to the liturgical year, linking the Sunday's Gospel to an element of the faith in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.



How the Lectionary Works

The Lectionary (from the Latin word, *lectio*, for "reading") refers to the schedule of Scripture readings that we receive in the Mass each day. Though the entire Bible is not read, a significant portion of Scripture is given to us over a three year cycle. The Lectionary is shared by all Catholics who participate in the Roman rite, which is the most common rite throughout the world. The shared Scripture readings help all Catholics, wherever they may live, experience the rhythm of the Church year.

There are two cycles of the Lectionary: the Sunday cycle and the Weekday cycle. The Sunday cycle consists of a reading from the Gospel, the Psalms and two additional readings, usually a selection from both the Old Testament and New Testament. The Gospel reading reflects where we are in the Church year or is part of the three-year Sunday cycle of reading through the Gospels. The Gospel also sets the prevalent theme for the accompanying Scripture readings. The Sunday cycle consists of:

- Year A: Gospel of Matthew
- Year B: Gospel of Mark
- Year C: Gospel of Luke

The Gospel of John is read in every cycle, particularly in the seasons of Lent and Easter.

The Weekday cycle consists of a Gospel reading, a Psalm and one additional


Videos and More
