Founded in 1967, the Pastoral Institute of the Brooklyn Diocese has a long tradition of providing programs and resources for **theological and pastoral formation of the laity** in Brooklyn and Queens. This tradition continues to the present time with programs that are specifically designed for lay pastoral leaders in our parishes.

The Pastoral Institute sponsors the following programs:

Lay Ministry Program – a **three-year program** that prepares pastoral leaders to serve as volunteer team members or coordinators for a particular ministry. Classes in English and Spanish start each September at locations throughout the Diocese.

Foundations for Ministry Program – a **ten-week, twenty-hour program** of theological up-dating for those engaged in ministry, for parish council members, and for those discerning enrollment in the three-year program.

M. A. Scholarship Program in Theology – prepares individuals to serve as a Pastoral Associate, Director of Religious Education, or in other professional leadership positions, by offering the opportunity for **graduate studies in theology** at a nearby university or seminary.

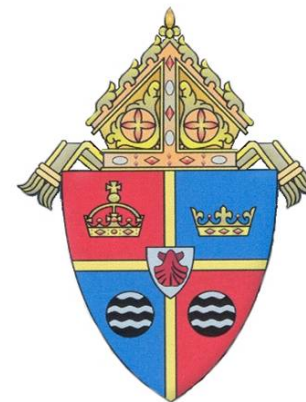

CALLED TO SERVE: VOCATIONS AND LAY MINISTRY

Through the Sacrament of Baptism every Christian has a vocation - a call from God - to holiness and service. This call is lived out by being single, married, ordained as a priest or deacon, or consecrated as a religious brother or sister. The Holy Spirit invites all of us to share our gifts, talents, and lives in service to others. Jesus calls us from a silent voice deep within to "Come and follow me".

PRIESTHOOD

A priest is a Christian, a member of the Church, who is called by God to proclaim the “Good News” of salvation to the world and to lead God’s people in worship, especially in making present the saving sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross in the Eucharist. He is privileged to act “in persona Christi” (in the person of Christ), especially in the celebration of the Sacraments: he gives the life of Christ to people in Baptism; he forgives their sins in Reconciliation; he anoints the sick; he witnesses vows as a couple is joined together in Marriage.

A priest also witnesses to the presence of God by his daily lived faith, especially in the midst of a parish community. He encourages, consoles, rejoices, and supports his parishioners in their lived experience of faith. Some priests are members of religious communities (Franciscans, Jesuits, Vincentians, etc.) and other priests are “Diocesan Priests”. Most diocesan priests are “parish priests”, serving in a parish in his diocese, while others sometimes serve in “specialized ministries”, such as teaching or serving as a chaplain in a school, hospital, or the military.

RELIGIOUS LIFE

Throughout the centuries, men and women have responded to God's call to commit themselves wholly to God and God's people through the consecrated life.

DIACONATE

A Roman Catholic Deacon is an ordained clergyman who is entrusted by the diocesan bishop to baptize, officiate at weddings, wakes, burial services, administer Holy Communion, visit the sick and the imprisoned and engage in other charitable works. When possessing proper faculties, he may preach at Mass and other sacred services. Permanent Deacons may be married or single.

The diocesan Diaconate Formation Office prepares men, who are eligible and have been accepted through an evaluative process, to become deacons through a vigorous five-year program. Consisting of various “stages”, the formation program attends to the academic, pastoral, spiritual, and personal dimensions by providing the environment for theological development and growth in personal and communal prayer of each participant. Our goal is to “form” men who are truly committed to follow Christ by becoming “servant-leaders” with profound humility and unwavering desire to “serve” others. At present there are two formation tracks: English and Spanish.
