Over \$3 million has been contributed by the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Trust for these efforts.




Blessings and Challenges For Academies and Schools

In a couple of weeks, the most wonderful time of the year commences, to quote a recent Staples commercial herald-

ing the start of the academic year. What better time to assess the accomplishments of the previous academic year and consider the challenges of the future?

young people are headed to secondary schools across the metropolitan area this fall; 69 percent enrolling in Catholic secondary schools within the diocese, and the remainder to Catholic and private schools throughout the city as well as specialized, magnet, charter and public schools.

The Class of 2018 earned more than

\$4.3 million in scholarships and their education has prepared them to enroll in rigorous honors programs, advanced placement courses and the International Baccalaureate program to name just a few. Students who sat for the Regents examination in algebra and/or living environment and earned the required grade now move onto other courses.

Graduates have received recognition and commendation from numerous agencies, schools and sponsors of academic competitions: the NYC STEM Expo, Art and Poetry Contest of the NYC Environmental Protection Agency (Water Resources), Mathletics, Pax Christi, Propagation of the Faith, the Senator Martin Golden Essay Contest. All of these experiences testify to the accomplishments of the students.

During the past year, academy/school students experienced education outside the classroom walls as they journeyed to Broadway, local cinemas, the NYPD and FDNY sites, Shakespeare festival, MOMA, the National Museum of Mathematics, NY Hall of Science, the United Nations and St. Patrick's Cathedral to name a few.

Of course, to nurture students' faith formation, academies/schools collaborate with their aligned parishes for weekly liturgies, prayer services, sacramental preparation programs and an education in the Catholic faith. Putting faith into action means providing service and care for the elderly, poor and those most in need.

Similarly, the Catholic secondary schools are proud of the accomplishments of their students. Graduates in the Class of 2018, who numbered 2,812, will be attending colleges and universities across the country. There are graduates moving onto US military academies, each of the Ivy League colleges, most of the "Seven Sister Colleges," and the top tier colleges as named by the major ranking organizations. The class has earned a total of over \$560 million in scholarships. Truly the future belongs to these students!

The secondary schools, with their array of coveted partnerships with colleges and universities, have provided an education for these students in the competencies and skills found necessary for success: adaptive thinking, critical thinking and problem solving competencies, communication and collaboration skills, inquiry and technology skills. Of course, and most importantly, students learn moral and ethical decision-making and are grounded in the Catholic faith teaching and practice.

As we look back on the year, we can say it has been good, thanks be to God.

Declining Population

Yet there are challenges that our Catholic academies/schools, on both levels, must face. A recent study by Richard Murnane of Harvard University and Sean Reardon of Stanford University reveals that the market share of students has declined in Catholic schools. Citing demographic shifts, the decline of Catholics living in the northeast, the cost of an education, and the priorities of families facing financial constraints, the researchers present an opportunity to reflect on and address moving forward.

The Diocese of Brooklyn commissioned a comprehensive study of the academies/schools, called Generation in 2016. This study revealed that current parents rate "structure/discipline/respect for others as the most important consideration in school selection;" prospective parents emphasize an "affordable, high quality education." Further conclusions found that "state of the art facilities/equipment/ technology and curricular innovation were least likely to be identified with all Catholic academies/schools. Note the dis-

St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Academy is located in the Prospect/Lefferts Gardens area of Flatbush. St. Francis has educated children for more than 100 years in the Catholic tradition of excellence. The faith formation program enables students to develop a deeper understanding of the teachings of Jesus. The school follows the N.Y.S. curriculum for core subjects (math, ELA, science and social studies) and is committed to including physical education, art and music to enhance the educational program.

The academy participates in the Performing Arts School Residency Program, which teaches film making to fourth graders, play writing and producing to sixth graders, and Shakespeare study and performance to eighth graders. Students' also display their talents at the annual Christmas and Spring shows. Faculty and staff organize and run various afterschool clubs, including dance, basketball, baking, martial arts, and arts and crafts.

Technology is provided and updated to enhance the learning experience. Weekly technology classes are held in a computer room equipped with PCs, and classrooms have interactive whiteboards. Grades four through eight are equipped with one-to-one Chromebooks used in class. Google Education is used on a daily basis.

Students graduate St. Francis equipped with strong study skills, time-management and note-taking techniques that prepare them for high school, college and careers. Graduates who move on to Catholic high schools often receive scholarships.

The school's staff consists of dedicated educators and is blessed with the continual presence of the Sisters of St. Joseph since the school opened in 1909. Dedicated to our patron, St. Francis of Assisi, peace education is integral to the program. Students are instructed to act as peer mediators, classes include a focus on conflict resolution and non-violent behavior.

Tuition assistance is available through programs sponsored by the Diocese of Brooklyn and the St. Francis of Assisi Alumni Scholarship Program.

St. Patrick Catholic Academy

Updated Building, New Technology, Expanded Curriculum

When St. Patrick Catholic Academy opens this fall, students will be delighted to see the transformation that took place in their school over the summer, including receiving accreditation by AdvancED.

Renovations at the Bay Ridge school include the creation of a new nursery classroom and the freshening-up of other classrooms, offices and hallways. In the past year, St. Patrick completed a long-needed renovation of the school's library and installed air conditioning in all of its classrooms. The library has continued to be updated, and is now fully-automated with the Follett Destiny program, giving students a greater opportunity to learn and conduct research.

Last year, an \$85,000 grant from the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Trust funded the installation of a LabLearner STEM lab, an in-school laboratory for physical, earth and life science experimental activities for kindergarten through eighth grade. The grant funded the installation of five work stations and storage equipment, the STEM curriculum, workbooks and professional development.

"We are very grateful to the St.

Elizabeth Ann Seton Trust Foundation," said Principal Kathleen Curatolo.

"The use of the LabLearner STEM Lab, coupled with our outstanding STEM teacher, resulted in exemplary scores on New York State fourth and eighth grade science exams and the Living Environment

St. Patrick has also expanded its academic, enrichment and arts programs. Stages on the Sound, an arts residency program, teaches filmmaking in grade four, persuasive speaking in grade six and Shakespeare in the eighth grade. Nursery to fifth grade study Italian, and students in the upper grades have the choice of studying Spanish, Italian, Latin or Arabic.

New York State Regents courses are also offered in algebra, living environment and earth science. Last school year, 100 percent of the eighth grade class passed the New York State Algebra I Regents Exam, and 90 percent of the seventh and eighth grade passed the Living Environment Regents Exam.

Limited spaces are still available for this school year, starting at the nursery level, which offers half- and full-day options.

Our Lady of Grace Catholic Academy (OLGCA), Gravesend, is looking forward to a year of new beginnings and old traditions.

Kelly Wolf is starting her second year as principal. Her background as a STREAM coordinator and director of religious education has brought a fresh look to the school. Wolf has been careful to make changes that help to move OLGCA's curriculum and students into the ever-changing world of technology, all while maintaining its traditions. OLGCA maintains its mission of providing a nurturing, Catholic, academic, safe environment where students are encouraged and challenged to develop and grow spiritually, intellectually, morally and socially.

The academy continually scores above the national average on standardized tests. This past year, eighth graders received \$334,400 in scholarships. It is not only an incredible academic achievement of the students, but also shows the strength and dedication of OLGCA's committed faculty.





On the Road to Catholic HS, TACHS Exam Is the First Step

During the fall of 2018, eighth grade students in the Diocese of Brooklyn and the Archdiocese of New York will be taking the Test for Admission into Catholic High Schools (TACHS). The TACHS will test current eighth-grade students who are interested in attending a Catholic high school beginning in September 2019.

In order to be admitted into Catholic high schools, an eighth grader who attends school within the Diocese of Brooklyn should take the TACHS admissions exam on Saturday, Nov. 3.

The test results from TACHS, along with school records on the applicant record, are then sent to the high school principals to assist them in making Catholic high schools' admission decisions. Each student's information will be sent to three high schools of his/her choice.

High schools release admission notices to students beginning Jan. 16, 2019. The registration fee for the 2018 TACHS exam is \$63 per student. Registration opened Aug. 20 and students can register either online at www.tachsinfo.com or by calling 1-866-61TACHS (1-866-618-2247).

The TACHS exam is only offered to students currently attending eighth grade in the 2018-19 academic year. Students who are interested in applying to a Catholic high school in other grades should contact the high school admissions director.

The TACHS exam measures academic achievement in reading, written expression and mathematics, along with an ability section on general reasoning abilities.

It is a norm-referenced standardized test. Scores are based on a national sample that compares the students' scores to the scores of other eighth graders measured at the same time of year that the TACHS is administered. Scores are also compared to the scores of all students tested this fall.

The TACHS exam is a secure exam: therefore, students are encouraged to review the TACHS Student Handbook for information concerning this exam. One way to prepare for the exam is to answer the practice questions in the handbook, which is available online and will be available at Catholic elementary and high schools, and public schools with eighth grade classes in early September.

The handbook contains sample test questions as well as information regarding the TACHS program, including an event calendar, registration details, high school expo dates and an eligibility form for students requesting extended testing time. The

program adheres to all deadlines as outlined in the handbook and on the website.

Scholarship and financial aid decisions are made by each individual high school. Questions regarding scholarships and financial aid should be directed to the high schools that conduct their individual open houses beginning in September.





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Preserving Catholic Schools' Charism 'Has to Be Intentional'

OLDENBURG, Ind. (CNS) -Although women religious - once synonymous with Catholic education have been disappearing from U.S. classrooms in recent decades, many Catholic schools are taking extra steps to make sure that even as these sisters age or their numbers decrease, the charisms that infused the schools they founded will not be lost.

This was the challenge faced by the Oldenburg Academy of the Immaculate Conception, located in Oldenburg, Ind. The school, founded by the Sisters of St. Francis of Oldenburg in 1852, came under laity supervision in 1994 and no longer has any women religious on staff.

And yet, their spirit still lives within the walls they established 166

"The Franciscan values have helped me to understand my role in this world," said outgoing senior Rachel Stoll, one of the more than 200 students at the academy. She readily reeled off three of the values held dear to the Oldenburg Franciscans: care of creation, prayer and dignity of the human person.

"One of the unique values that the religious men and women brought to their Catholic schools was a distinct charism in addition to their catechetical formation," said John Schoenig, senior director of teacher formation and education policy for the University of Notre Dame's Alliance for Catholic Education.

"Your life would have been much different as a Catholic school student

if you were in a school run by the Daughters of Charity than if you were in a school run by Benedictines," he said. "It's because the charism would have been there."

That notion of charism in the schools eroded as religious vocations declined and Catholic schools were staffed by lay teachers who came from many different universities, worshipped in many different parishes and had many different approaches to education, Schoenig said.

Rediscovering Founding Ideals

But in recent years Catholic schools nationwide have recognized the need to rediscover the charisms of their founding religious orders.

Barbara McGraw Edmondson, chief leadership and program officer at the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA), said this understanding is emphasized each year at annual NCEA conventions when speakers stress: "We stand on shoulders of giants."

"And we really do," she added, noting that it's crucial for schools to keep that alive in any way they can because the founding orders are "such a gift and a legacy of Catholic education."

At Oldenburg Academy, values of the Franciscan charism are emblazoned on a huge black-and-white mural of smiling women religious that graces the front hallway.

But as this school has discovered, preserving the legacy of its founding order requires a commitment deeper

than slogans or photographic displays.

"It has to be intentional. It isn't just going to happen. You have to make a decision to work on it," said Oldenburg president Diane Laake, who added that the school is "doing a better job at claiming and naming and identifying the charism than we did 30 and 40 years ago."

Now the school has a specific Franciscan curriculum in religion classes and group trips to Assisi, the Italian hometown of St. Francis. A Franciscan value is also chosen each year to define school activities.

"It is truly a Franciscan school," said Franciscan Sister Marjorie Niemer, who acts as a liaison between the academy and the Sisters of St. Francis of Oldenburg. "We are extremely proud of what the administration and the board of directors has been able to do to promote Catholic education, Franciscan education."

The school's Franciscan identity is bolstered by the close proximity of the sisters, since the academy is on the same campus as the Oldenburg motherhouse, where about 120 of the 183 remaining sisters still live. Students pass sisters in the halls, lending an arm at times to help a sister's unsteady feet.

The students also have the opportunity to "adopt" a sister and eat lunch with her once every two weeks, in a school-sponsored program called "Adopt-a-Sis."

"I feel like I'm really close to them," said Nicholas Hoff, an incoming sophomore. "They almost seem like family to me."

Service Leadership Prepares Today's Students to Succeed

(StatePoint) - Students are more successful when they practice leadership outside of the classroom. A recent survey conducted by Harris Poll found that 91 percent of respondents agreed with this statement.

This survey was conducted on behalf of Lead2Feed, a free student leadership program attracting more than a million students and over 6,000 educators across all 50 states.

There's already real-world evidence supporting the survey data's sentiment. Participants in Lead2Feed thought critically about their role in their communities, and say they gained the following benefits:

Engaged Teachers

The Lead2Feed Student Leadership Program takes students through the steps to design and implement an effective, relevant service project. Teachers and advisers can enter their student teams into the Lead2Feed Challenge, where they can win grants for their school and charity.

When teachers participate alongside students, the entire classroom is given an opportunity to transform their way of thinking.

"What I realized was that the leadership principles I was trying to teach my students had actually began to transform me as well," says Allison Silverman, a teacher at Port Chester Middle School where students have earned more than \$50,000 for charity and more than \$15,000 in technology grants for their school over the six years they've been involved in the program. "I gained renewed confidence in my work and in my profession," Silverman said.

Relevant Lessons

Classroom learning can often feel theoretical. When students lead their own community service projects, they have an opportunity to directly engage with realworld issues that have received national attention. Students at Miami's Design and Architecture Senior High (DASH, one of the winners of the Lead2Feed Challenge), sought to address the issue of mental health that has consumed the nation's psych through a project called "No More Stalling." They created signs for school bathroom stalls with hotlines for tough issues students may be facing.

The class of 2021 was transformed into problem solvers and they emerged with a vision," says DASH teacher Zudannie Nuñez-Hernandez.

Modern Skills

Working with fellow students to complete a project develops critical thinking, collaboration and communication skills, fostering the necessary attributes for students to become leaders within their classrooms and greater communities.

Before completing the Lead2Feed program, only 27 percent of participating students felt that they could work well with others, only 18 percent believed they could develop effective solutions to problems, and only 16 percent felt they could

communicate clearly and concisely with their peers. After completing the program, these numbers rose to 55 percent, 49 percent and 48 percent respectively.

"Feeding young minds and local community groups in need are all part of this leadership program where students use 21st century skills, literacy skills and service learning to refine their leadership skills and to benefit local nonprofits," says Diane Barrett, executive director of Lead2Feed's presenting foundation, The Foundation for Impact on Literacy and Learning.





parity between the accomplishments cited above and the perceptions expressed by those surveyed in the Generation study.

Bishop DiMarzio and his team of educators, marketers and financial consultants have worked together to develop highlevel media/public awareness programs to share the Good News of the Catholic academies/schools. Secondary and university partnerships have enhanced the academic programs of these communities through professional development programs for principals and teachers, creative and innovative approaches to teaching and learning, specific integration of technology within the curriculum and the classroom, summer prep programs as well as the dedication of targeted monies to open Learner Labs integrating STEM within the learning experience for all students.

All academies/schools now participate in a special program designed by Change Strategies to build and sustain enrollment by embracing relationships among families, parishes and faith formation programs.

This program has been a boost to enrollment: As of this writing, 25 academies/ schools have increased enrollment over the previous year's statistics with another 28 inching closer to this goal.

In September, 30,000 students will be welcomed into our schools/academies at both levels. A total of 44 academies have created strategic plans for the next three years with another 11 engaging in this process for 2018-19. Accreditation through AdvancED, a national accrediting institution continues. Dedicated teachers and principals have been renewed through participation in seminars and workshops designed to focus on student learning and as such enthusiasm runs high.

As we prepare for another academic year, we do so confidently with the hope that it be one of blessings shared and promises fulfilled for families and the academy/school communities.


