Link family stories to Bible stories (Creed)

Foster ongoing sacramental understanding (Sacraments)

Discuss and use different forms of prayer (Prayer)

Recognize and honor the dignity of every human person (Morality)

Grades Six through Grade Eight

Teach about Sacred Scripture (Creed)

Prepare candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation (Sacraments)

Demonstrate how to integrate prayer into one's life; especially the Mass (Prayer)

Explore how to recognize and confirm the face of Christ in others (Morality)

4. Prepare materials for your web site.

Planning for the start of a new catechetical year

Some Guiding Principles for Consideration

1. Digital registration be done for 2020-2021?
2. Register only once and renewable each year?
3. Budget for online curriculum and/or e-book and textbook.
4. Catechists trained for different teaching styles?
5. Parents and family members be trained and supported?
6. Determine best plan for your parish.
7. Consider all social distancing and other policies, including safe environment policies.
8. Pray and consult.

Frequently Asked Question #1

Where can I find recommended evangelization and catechetical resources to use and promote during these days of home study?

Frequently Asked Question # 2

How and when should I bring this year's parish religious education program to a close?

While each parish program is different, generally speaking parish religious education programs normally end sometime in late May or June. We recommend that catechetical leaders provide an end date for formal instruction but continue to communicate with parents and adult family members on a continuing basis. Some parishes may plan to provide resources during the summer and may even experiment with a summer program to provide additional opportunities for formation. All of this should be communicated clearly to every parent and adult family member through email with some form of a response to indicate the parent or adult family member has seen the memorandum.

Frequently Asked Question # 3

How do I register or re-register families for the catechetical year 2020-2021 and is online registration recommended?

It is highly recommended that all parish registration and re-registration is done using an online registration system. Many parishes use one already. If your parish does not already make use of one, options are available and will be posted on the Resource page. Keep in mind that registration information should only be collected initially upon entrance into the program, and then updated each year. It is common now throughout the United States that once a family is enrolled in religious education, the expectation is that they participate each year and are automatically registered for the next year's class. Now is a great time to implement that plan.

Frequently Asked Question # 4

How should we plan for the 2020-2021 catechetical year?

As of today, we are still uncertain about when we can get to the 'new normal'. It is probable that social distancing and other measures will be in place for a while. In addition, we may have a re-occurrence of the coronavirus in the fall or winter. It is highly recommended that every program of religious education has a formalized online option, either using the digital components of one of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) approved series or the Faith and Life Program provided on the Catholic Faith Technologies (My Catholic Faith Delivered) platform. Simply put, every program should make parents aware when they register that the religious education program may be done online with their assistance. In the case that programs can meet at some point, an alternative plan should be developed by parish leaders implementing all safety and health guidelines as well as any guidelines provided by the Diocese of Brooklyn. As things progress, more information will follow.

Frequently Asked Question # 5 Part 1

What about other programs like the Holy Spirit Institute for Service and Leadership, RCIA, Youth Ministry, Young Adult Ministry, Small Faith Sharing Groups, Pre-Cana, Living and Leading by Faith, etc.?

As you know, the Diocese of Brooklyn is blessed by having many partners that assist us in many and varied ways. These partners assist us by providing free or greatly reduced resources that have enabled us to continue to provide services during this out-of-the-office period. In addition, our Secretariat staff is available each day to provide you with any assistance you might need regarding our programs.

The Holy Spirit Institute for Service and Leadership continues to accept applications until June 1, 2020. Instruct anyone interested in applying to go to <https://www.bqonlineformation.org/> and click on the Holy Spirit Institute box for application in English and Spanish. **For the foreseeable future, the Holy Spirit Institute will conduct all courses online and use GO TO MEETING for class meetings throughout the year.**

The RCIA and RCIA Adapted for Children is still on hold until we receive further guidance. We'll update you as soon as possible. However, several RCIA groups are meeting virtually and continuing the journey until such time that they can be received into the Church.

Frequently Asked Question # 5 Part 2

Youth Ministry and Young Adult Ministry is continuing remotely using different formats depending on the local situation. A Diocesan Digital Event is being planned for the end of May. More information will follow.
